Where classes are combined to meet minimum class number requirements, per round prize money is paid only on the results of the combined class however series points for 1st to 8th placing will be awarded on the basis of the class the rider has entered. E.g. should 14 Girls and 15 Girls Classes be combined, BOTH the highest placed 14 Girl and the highest placed 15 Girl in the combined class will receive 120 points.

Classes with 8 or less riders will run three motos and transfer all but the highest points score to a final.

Champbikx Series ranking is determined by the rider's best five results from the series. Riders must compete in at least five rounds of the overall series to be eligible for the end of series awards.

Probikx Series ranking is determined by the rider's best six results from the series.

For both Probikx and Champbikx, in the case of a tie at the end of the series, the tie will be resolved as follows:

- First in favour of the rider who earned most first place finishes in the series
- Then, if a tie still remains, in favour of the rider who earned most second place finishes in the series – and so on.





2008-09 Champbikx SuperSeries Parameters.

- The 2008-09 BMXA Champbikx SuperSeries is for 14, 15 and 16 Girls and Boys 20” Classes with age determination being 2009 (year of competition rule) minus Year of Birth. The Champbikx SuperSeries is being run with two key objectives:
 1. To provide high level, exciting competition under quality conditions.
 2. To showcase riders for potential Talent ID Squad selection.
- The 2008-9 BMXA Champbikx SuperSeries will be run in conjunction with the Australian rounds of the Probikx and UCI BMX Oceania Ranking Series (for Junior and Elite Men and Women) and Australian National Championships.
- Each Champbikx SuperSeries round will be run as a block in conjunction with the Junior and Elite Classes within the various events.

- A condition of entry is that riders use the Official Series Sponsor’s number plate. This plate will be issued free to all riders at the first round of the series that they enter and must be used for all subsequent rounds.

Replacement of a lost or “left at home” plate will be at a cost of \$15 to the rider.

- Moto seeding and transfer per UCI BMX rules Chapter 11.
- Rider seeding to the motos will be by Time Trial qualification except for double header weekends where the time trial results will be used to seed the day 1 event and overall results from day 1 used to seed the day 2 event.

The Time Trial will comprise a single timed lap for each rider.

A rider not starting in the Time Trial will be given a default lap time of 99 seconds.

At a round where the time trial can not be run due to weather conditions or some other time constraint placed on the event, series ranking will be used for both seeding to motos and tie break for gate pick.

- To enable riders to gain experience in UCI BMX SuperCross and Olympic format events, Special lane selection rules adapted from BMX SuperCross “last run lap time determines rider selection of starting lane for next run” rule apply.

The time trial results will determine the gate pick for moto 1. Fastest time trial lap having first gate pick.

For all subsequent races, the rider’s placing in each run will determine the gate pick for the next run with the highest placed rider having first gate pick. Where two riders have equal placing in their previous run, the time trial results will be used as a tie breaker.

- A minimum of 5 riders per class is required. Where classes are combined to make minimum numbers, per round prize money is paid on the results in the combined class however series points for 1st to 8th placing will be awarded on the basis of the class the rider has entered.
- Prize Pool for each round is \$600 for Boys Classes and \$600 for Girls Classes, paid for podium finishes only with the breakdown per BMXA rules section G. 1st - 50%, 2nd -30%, 3rd - 20%.
- Series points will be allocated for each event per the Probikx / Champbikx schedule attached. A rider’s overall series placing is determined by the rider’s best five results from the series. Riders must compete in at least five rounds of the overall series to be eligible for the end of series awards.
- Overall prizes to be awarded for 1st to 3rd in each Class at the end of the Series are for Australian riders only.
 - 16yr Boys and Girls - 1st \$800, 2nd \$600, 3rd \$400
 - 15yr Boys and Girls – 1st \$700, 2nd \$500, 3rd \$300
 - 14yr Boys and Girls – 1st \$600, 2nd \$400, 3rd \$250





2008-09 BMX Australia Probikx Series Parameters.

- The 2008-09 BMXA Probikx Series is for Junior Women, Junior Men, Elite Women and Elite Men, 20" Classes with age determination being 2009 (year of competition rule) minus Year of Birth.
- Where the one event doubles as an UCI Oceania Ranking and Probikx Series round, UCI Continental Ranking rules will apply to the event.
- Each Probikx Series round will be run as a block in conjunction with the Champbikx Series classes within the various events.

- A condition of entry is that riders use the Official Series Sponsor's number plate. This plate will be issued free to all riders at the first round of the series that they enter and must be used for all subsequent rounds.

Replacement of a lost or "left at home" plate will be at a cost of \$15 to the rider.

- Allocation of race numbers will respect the assigned UCI BMX Permanent Career Numbers.
- Moto seeding and transfer per UCI BMX rules Chapter 11.
- For stand alone Probikx rounds, rider seeding to the motos will be by Time Trial qualification except for double header weekends where the time trial results will be used to seed the day 1 event and overall results from day 1 used to seed the day 2 event.

The Time Trial will comprise a single timed lap for each rider.

A rider not starting in the Time Trial will be given a default lap time of 99 seconds.

At a round where the time trial can not be run due to weather conditions or some other time constraint placed on the event, series ranking will be used for both seeding to motos and tie break for gate pick.

- Combined UCI Ranking and Probikx events will use the current UCI Continental seeding convention based on the rider's progressive UCI Pacific-Oceania Continental ranking.
- To enable riders to gain experience in UCI BMX SuperCross and Olympic format events, at stand alone Probikx rounds, special lane selection rules adapted from BMX SuperCross "last run lap time determines rider selection of starting lane for next run" rule apply.

The time trial results will determine the gate pick for moto 1. Fastest time trial lap having first gate pick.

For all subsequent races, the rider's placing in each run will determine the gate pick for the next run with the highest placed rider having first gate pick. Where two riders have equal placing in their previous run, the time trial results will be used as a tie breaker.

- A minimum of 5 riders per class is required. Where classes are combined to make minimum numbers, series points will be awarded on overall placing in the combined class.
- Prize Pool for each round is **\$3000** with the amount for each class determined by entry numbers (true equity method). Within each class payment is per UCI schedule. i.e. 1st to 8th placing: 40%, 20%, 10%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%.
- Series points will be allocated for each event per the Probikx / Champbikx schedule. A rider's overall series placing is determined by the rider's best 6 results from the series.
- Overall Series prizes awarded for 1st to 3rd in each Class.

2008-09 UCI BMX

Pacific Oceania Continental Ranking Series Parameters.

The information provided here is a summary of the rules applicable to the Continental Ranking Series. For full details refer to the UCI BMX Rule Book and UCI World Continental BMX Ranking Rules available on the UCI web site www.uci.ch.

- Each Continent will have their own separate ranking with the Pacific Oceanic Continental Ranking comprising All Oceanic, Asian and African countries.
- The Pacific Oceania Series comprises 10 continental races open to all suitably licensed riders and one national championship event per nation open for riders who hold a passport in the respective country.
- A rider may compete on more than one continent, but the rider can not transfer their points from one continent to another.
- A rider's best 7 results from the 10 Oceania rounds plus points from their National Championship count towards their overall Continental Ranking.
- Any class with less than 5 riders shall be combined. Where a class is combined, ranking points are awarded on the basis of combined race results with Elite Riders receiving points from the Elite Schedule and Junior Riders receiving points from the Junior Schedule.
- All continental races are Category 3 events for Junior Women, Junior Men, Elite Women and Elite Men 20" Classes. Age determination is Year of competition (2009) minus Year of Birth.
- Moto seeding and transfer per UCI BMX rules Chapter 11. Seeding of riders to the motos will be based UCI Oceania Continental Ranking which is based on the best 7 results from the 10 round 2008-09 Oceania Continental Series plus points from the 2009 National Championship round.
